APPLE BLOSSOM PARK OFFICIALLY OPENS

VAUGHAN, ON – In celebration of the official opening of Apple Blossom Park, Mayor Linda Jackson and Members of Council joined special guests and residents as they participated in a ribbon-cutting ceremony Sunday.

“The City of Vaughan is committed to providing our residents with outstanding parks and green spaces,” said Mayor Jackson. “They are an integral part of our great City, serving to strengthen our community by acting as gathering places and offering excellent recreational opportunities. In keeping with Council’s commitment to environmental stewardship, we are working to make Vaughan a green city. This opening is an example of that goal. Apple Blossom Park is now part of over 630 hectares of parks and green spaces in Vaughan. This is in addition to 200 playgrounds, several trail systems, and numerous sports fields.”

The park is 1.62 hectares and is located at 220 Apple Blossom Drive in Thornhill. Facilities include a fully accessible junior and senior playground, a mini soccer field, lighted walkways and sitting areas.

The Senior Management and Parks Development Teams also attended the opening. Entertainment was provided by Jelly Belly the clown and refreshments were available.

“Apple Blossom Park offers our residents a wonderful outdoor experience,” said Ward 4 Councillor Sandra Yeung Racco. “I would like to thank our design team and contractor for doing a marvellous job. This park not only provides us with a place to relax, exercise and enjoy the open air, but the key feature of this park is that we were able to preserve several mature trees, offering natural shade canopies for the residents.”
